

Are Smart Cities Real?

On December 11th, 2013, **Meeting of the Minds**, in collaboration with the **City of Amsterdam** and **Cisco Systems**, organized a ninety-minute TelePresence conversation with urban sustainability leaders from Amsterdam, San Jose, Boston and Detroit to share best practices, challenges and opportunities related to smart cities. A live audience of 100+ participants joined the event in Amsterdam (as part of the coinciding *Minds of Amsterdam* conference) as well as 270+ webcast viewers.

Key themes of the event:

- Are smart cities real?
- What is the biggest challenge to smart cities? Is that challenge also an opportunity?
- What is the return on investment for smart city technology and innovations?
- How is the city of Detroit embracing new technology and innovation while at the same time distributing the benefits as widely as possible?
- What are some fresh ideas regarding public financing for smart city initiatives?
- How can we better communicate the benefits of smart city investment to citizens?
- How can we encourage more citizen engagement and collaboration in the smart city movement?
